Seedlings News

- Seedlings have had fun learning in our 'All about me' topic. We talked about where we lived and then looked at our houses using Google street view. We were very proud of the super models we made!
- We have also been learning about our bodies; naming different body parts and the amazing things our bodies can do. We've been thinking about the people such as doctors and nurses who help us to stay healthy and well. We have loved looking after each other in our doctors role play area too!





Oak Class News

- In our topic 'All about me' we have been finding out about our senses and how they help us to find out about the world around us. We have tried to use lots of different words to describe objects the leaf feels 'prickly', the lemon tastes 'sour, the vinegar smells 'disgusting'!
- In maths we have been comparing weight and using scales to find out which objects are heavier and which are lighter. We have also spotted patterns everywhere in our classroom and outside. We have used beads, buttons, cars even ourselves!- to create our own repeating patterns.
- This week we found out that Tinkerbell has come to stay in our classroom whilst the weather is so bad. We haven't seen her yet as she is so shy but she wrote to tell us she loves to watch us learn our sounds and we are writing letters to her to make her feel at home.


















Willow Class News

- In Literacy we have been reading The Gingerbread Man. We read the story carefully, acted it out and used adjectives to describe the characters. We have written our own instructions before making our own gingerbread people. We loved smelling the spices coming from our new school kitchen.
- In maths, we have been learning about number bonds to 10 and 20. We have been using our related facts to help us. If we know 2+8=10 then 12+8=20. Some of the children have created their own maths game using counters and quizzed their friends.
- The children have also created their own piece of music using untuned percussion instruments. We have learnt stick notation to record these and performed them to each other.









Maple Class News

- Maple Class were learning about democracy last week and how the role of the school councillor is important. We voted and elected our new school councillors in class and across the school.
- As it is the dance festival soon, we are working hard to learn the four dance routines. The children will be rehearsing over the next week using the props and costumes.
- We have also been busy planning, painting and completing our art for the Harvest Festival Assembly. The art is in the style of Joan Miro. As a class, we picked 'Autumn Essence' as our inspiration. The children have surpassed my expectations and produced some lovely artwork in acrylic paints.

Rowan Class News

- In English, we have been learning how to empathise with characters through a radio programme study, based on the book 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo, which links with our World War II topic.
- In History, we have studied aspects of World War II, including local events. We learnt how Beaumanor Hall was used as a listening station and created our own codes to crack!
- In Dance, we are learning a Bhangra dance, ready to share with you at the Harvest Festival.
- All children in the class have been trained as Playground Leaders and are enjoying organising games for our KS1 children to play at lunchtimes. They are taking their responsibilities seriously and being great role-models.
- After half-term, our book studies will be based on: Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo and The Firework Maker's Daughter by Philip Pullman.
