We have learnt the story of Little Red Riding Hood in English and retold it using a story map. We are now writing the story in little parts, with a focus on our phonics for spelling, capital letters and full stops.

In maths, we have been using part-part whole models to help us with addition. We have been counting on and back in our heads and have been learning to estimate on and use a number line.

In history, we've began our learning on Remembrance Day. We are learning about why it is important to remember and what we remember the day for.

In PE, we have started our new topic all about dance, we've been counting in 8 beat bars and created our own secret garden dances.

Maple Class are looking forward to the busy weeks ahead.





### ASDA's CASHPOT FOR SCHOOLS'


We have signed Kilby St Mary's Primary School up for the 'Asda's Cashpot for Schools' event!
