Morning Routine

All children should arrive by 8.50am. If for any reason you are running late, please telephone the school office.

End of the Day

At 3.20pm the children will be discharged from the classroom one at a time. Each child will be encouraged to spot the person picking them up before being discharged. Please stand where your child will be able to see you. If you are unavoidably late, your child will be kept in class until 3.30, after which they will be taken to after school club whilst we try to contact you.

Classroom Behaviour

Our aim in Oak Class is to have a positive learning environment, whereby the children feel safe, secure, and confident to share ideas with their peers and learn constructively. We use the terms bucket filling and bucket dipping in our classroom. You fill your friend's buckets when you show kindness, patience, and respect. Similarly, you dip into your friend's buckets when you are rude, unkind, or hurt them. We all aim to have full buckets and fill other people's buckets.

Rewards

Daily children will get verbal praise, acknowledgement and stickers for good behaviour and work. Each week on a Friday afternoon the children will have 'golden time'. This is a 30-minute session where children will get to engage in a chosen activity. These include using resources that are not available outside of golden time. In addition, star of the week, from each year group, will also be

announced during assembly on Tuesday. Exceptional work and children who show continued good behaviour will be sent to Miss Hartshorne for a Head Teacher's award.

Phonics

Each day, Reception and Year One will be taught a new grapheme and phoneme correspondence, sound-letter relationship. With weekly review sessions to cement their knowledge and understanding. Also, guided reading sessions will happen three times a week in small groups. Children will learn to decode the words, read with fluency and prosody.

Guided Reading

On Wednesdays, once the children can decode 95% of the words independently and have completed the guided reading sessions, reading books will be sent home in the children's book bags. Additionally, children will also take a book to read for pleasure. Children do not need to be able to read this book individually, instead it's sent home to spark their love for reading. We would really appreciate it if you could read that book with your child and work on their comprehension skills. These will both be sent in the children's book bag along with their reading records for you to note any reading done by or with the children.

PE

In Oak Class, the children will need to come into school wearing a suitable PE kit for both indoor and outdoor activities, including footwear. The PE kit must be

clearly labelled with the child's name. PE is on a Wednesday morning and a Thursday afternoon. Indoor/Outdoor PE - Plain black or navy shorts/joggers, plain white t-shirt, trainers and a black or navy jumper/hoodie.
