Our aim in Rowan Class is to have a positive learning environment, whereby the children feel safe, secure and confident to share ideas with their peers and learn from their own and others misconceptions constructively.

Rewards: Children can receive recognition for any positive behaviour. For example; listening carefully, following instructions, answering questions, being kind etc. This can be in the form of praise, a sticker and certificates. Each week on a Friday afternoon the children will have 'golden time'.

Exceptional work and children who show continued good behaviour will be sent to Miss Hartshorne for a head teacher's award.

Morning Routine

All children should arrive by 8.50am and line up in the designated line. If for any reason you are running late please telephone the school office.

End of the Day

At 3.20pm the children will be discharged from the classroom one at a time. Each child will be encouraged to spot the person picking them up before being discharged. Please stand where your child will be able to see you. If you are unavoidably late, your child will be kept in class until 3.30, after which they will be taken to after school club whilst we try to contact you.

PE

In Rowan Class, the children will need to come into school wearing a suitable PE kit for both indoor and outdoor activities, including footwear. The PE kit must be clearly labelled with the child's name. PE is on a Wednesday morning and a Thursday afternoon.

Indoor/Outdoor PE - Plain black or navy shorts/joggers, plain white t-shirt, trainers and a black or navy jumper/hoodie.

Homework

Each Monday your child will bring home their spellings where they will be tested on Friday and Mrs Purdy will set an English homework which will need to be returned to school by the following Monday in order for the next week's homework to be set. On Tuesday each week, a maths mental arithmetic book will be given where the children will be asked to complete a complete test i.e section A,B and C. This will need to be returned by the following Tuesday in order for it to be marked and the next homework to be set. In the event of the children completing their homework early, they are encouraged to bring it into school. The children are also expected to read at home on a daily basis. They have lots of opportunities to read and enjoy books throughout the week. The children do not need their own pencil case or additional stationery.

Expectations

We have high expectations for the children in all areas of the curriculum and in their class books and homework books. They should take pride in their work at all times..
